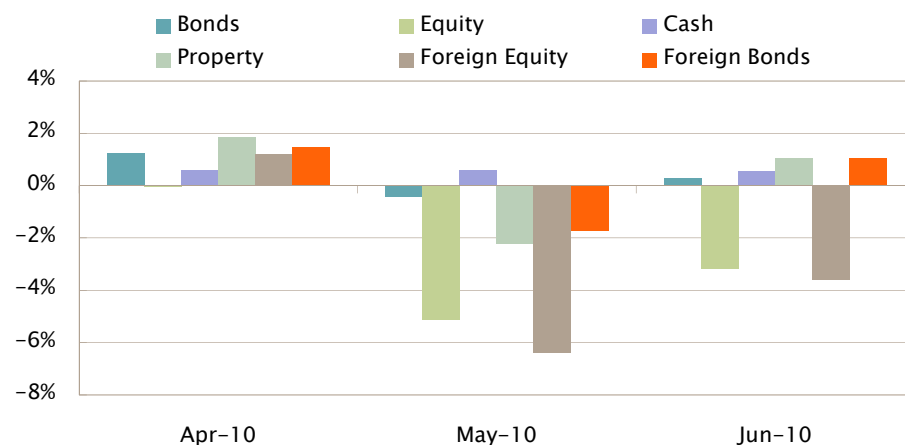
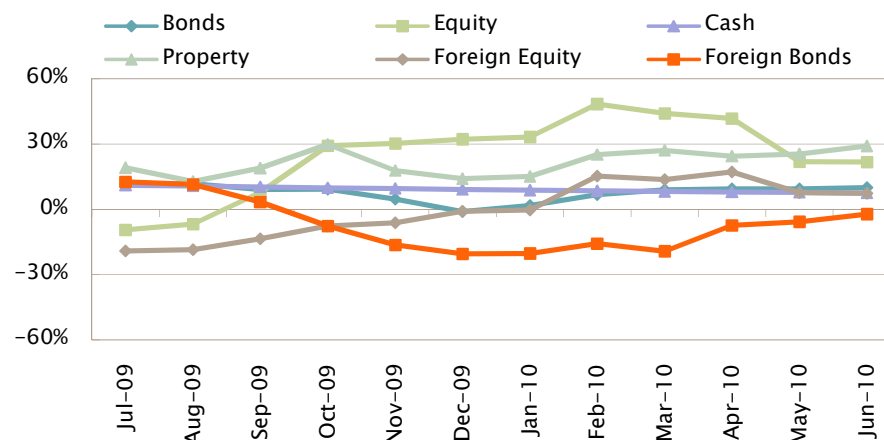

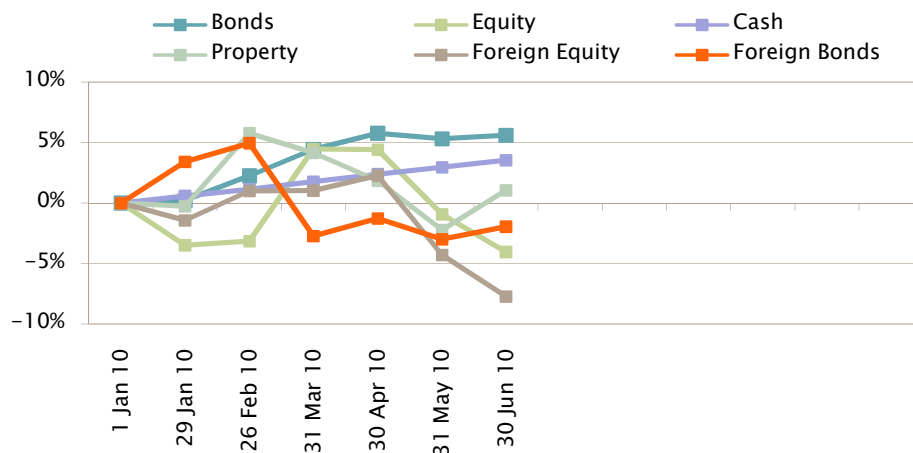
ASSET CLASS MONTHLY RETURNS

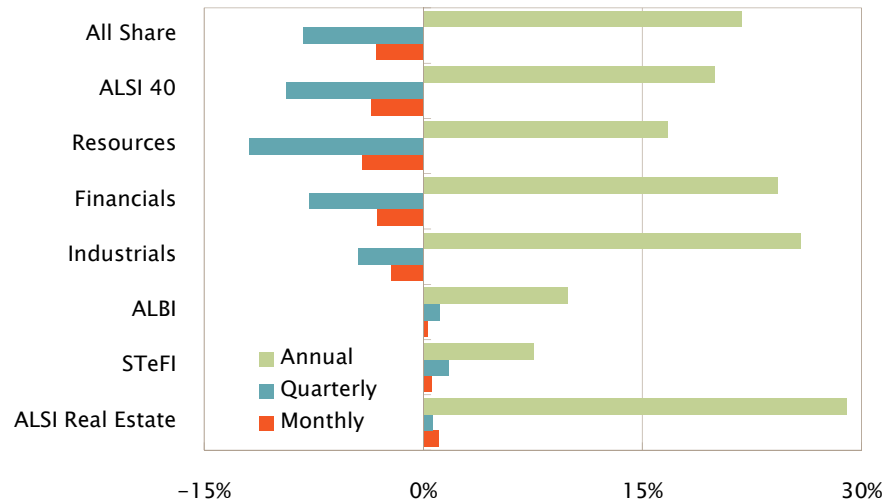

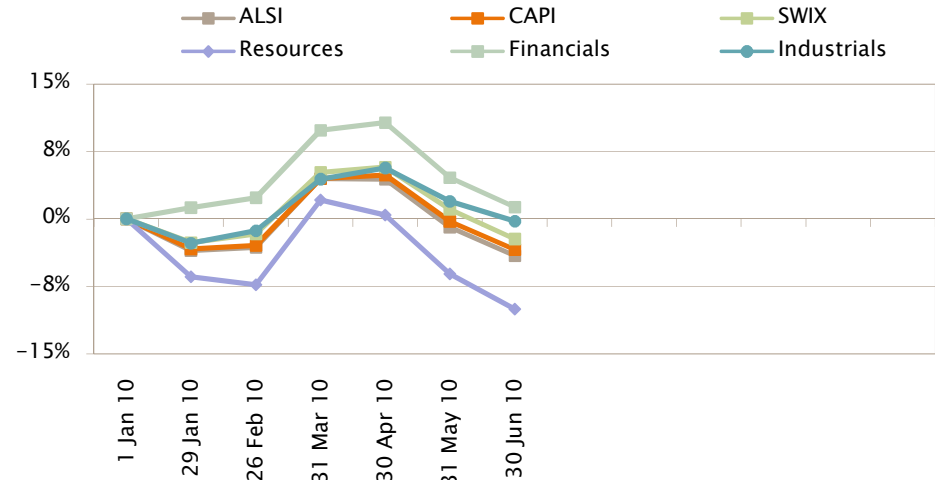

RETURNS OF FTSE/JSE SECTORS & INDICES

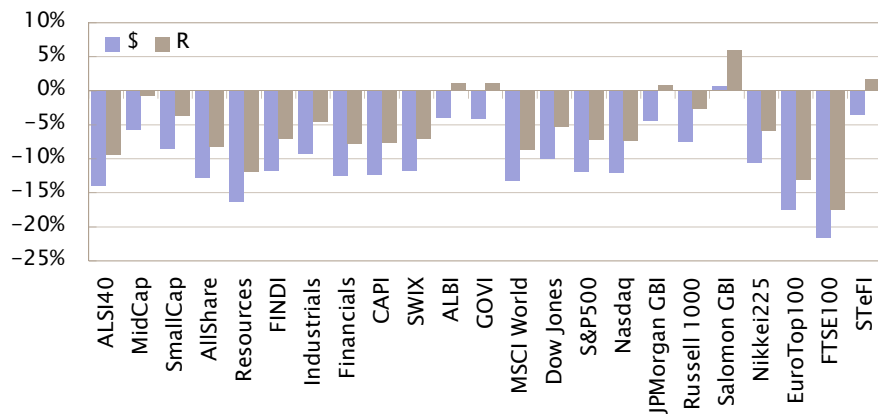


SECTOR & INDICES PERFORMANCE – YEAR TO DATE

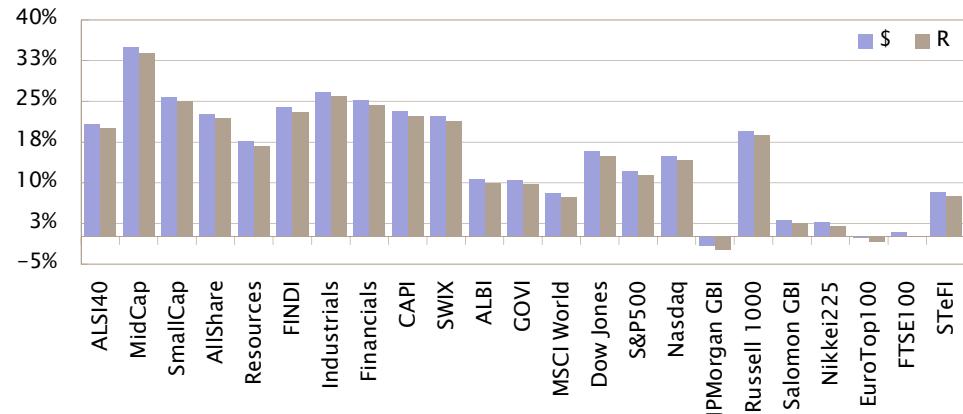


HOW THE WORLD MARKET INDICES PERFORMED

QUARTERLY RETURN OF MAJOR INDICES

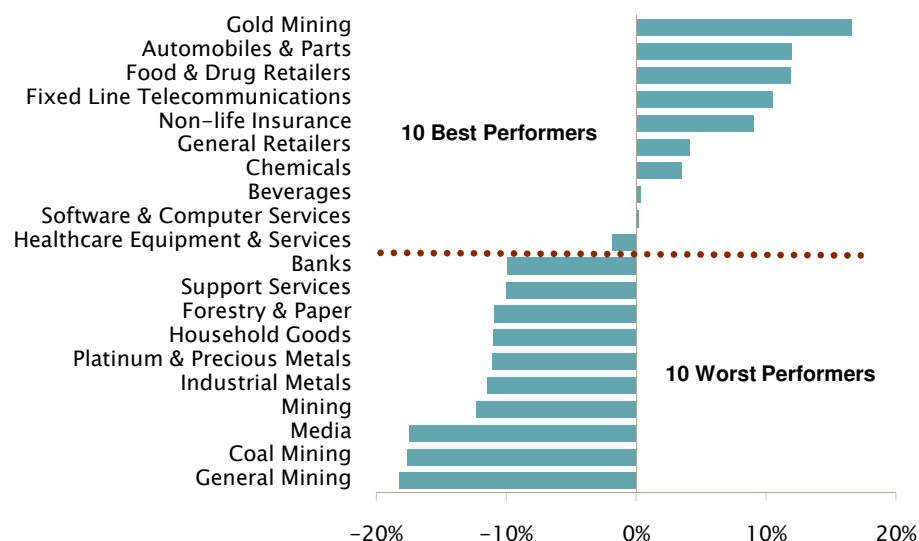


ANNUAL RETURN OF MAJOR INDICES

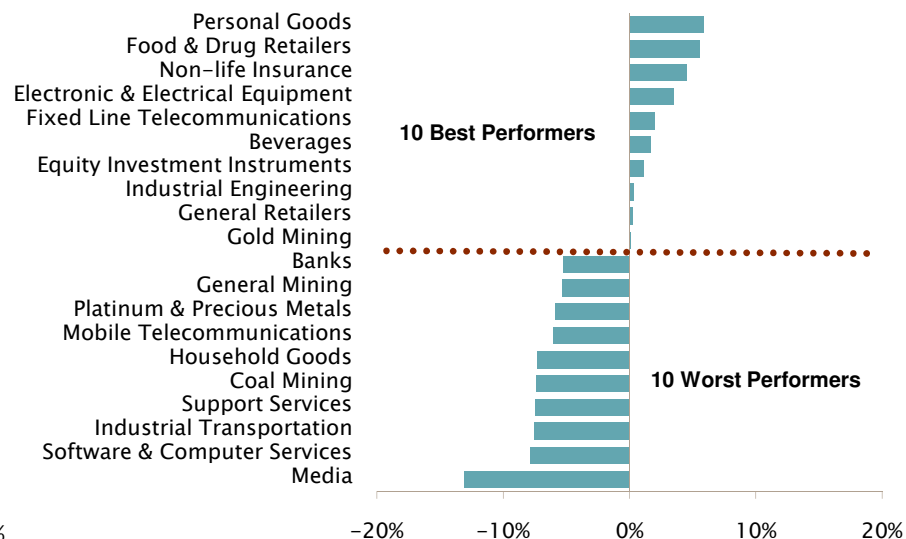


EQUITY MARKET – HOW THE EQUITY SECTORS PERFORMED

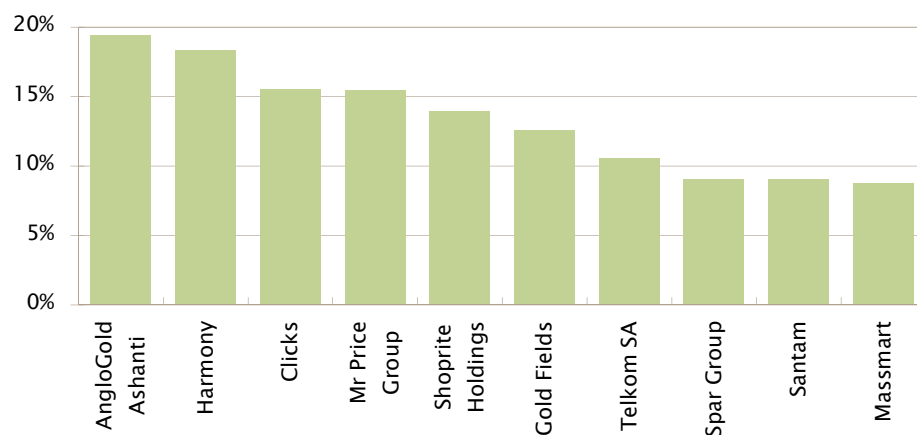

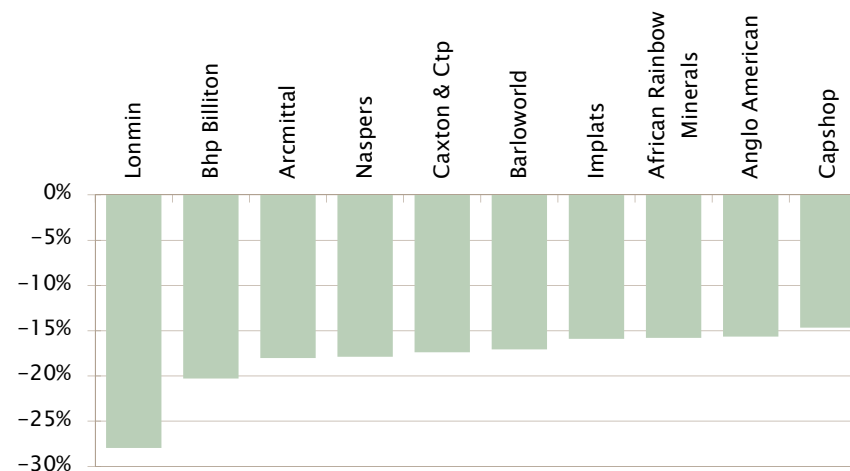

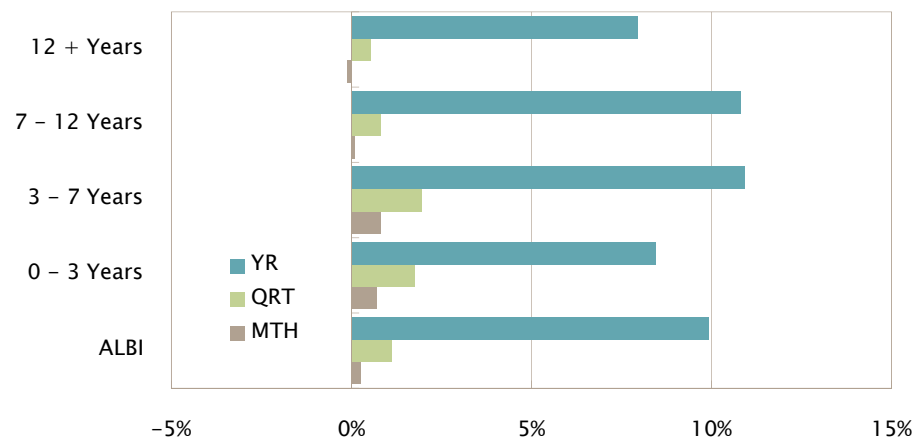

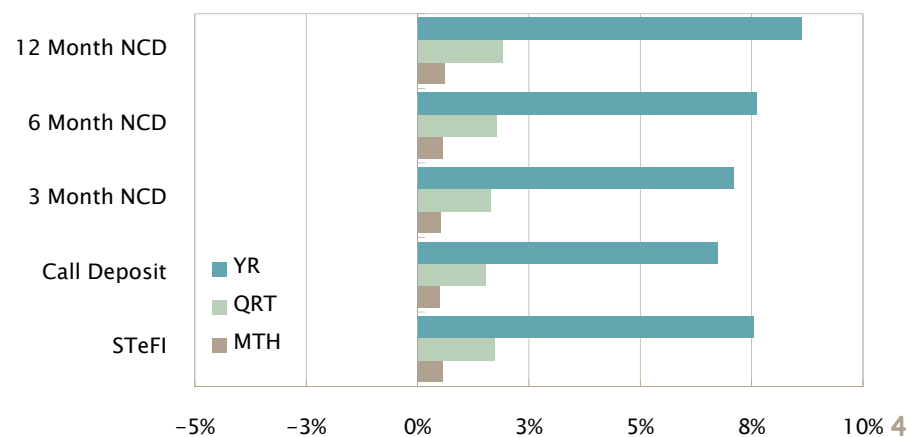


HOW THE FIXED INTEREST MARKET PERFORMED

RETURNS OF BOND SECTORS

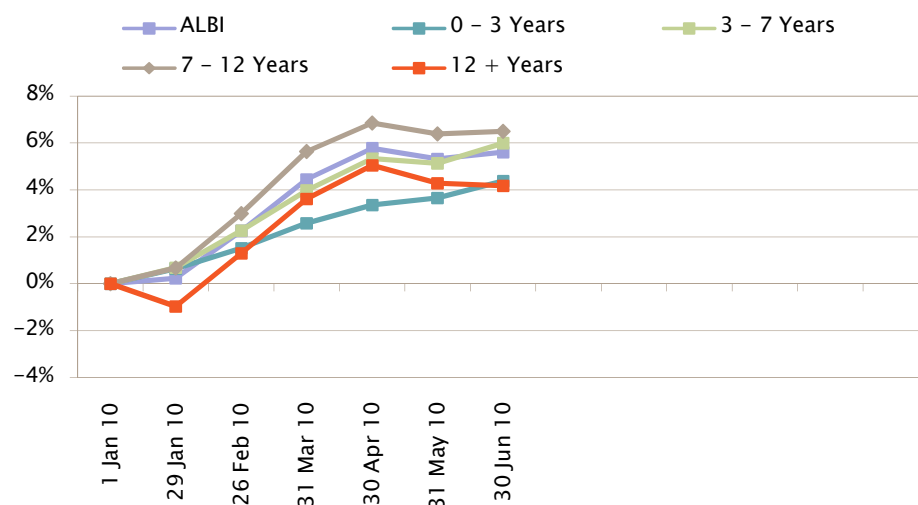

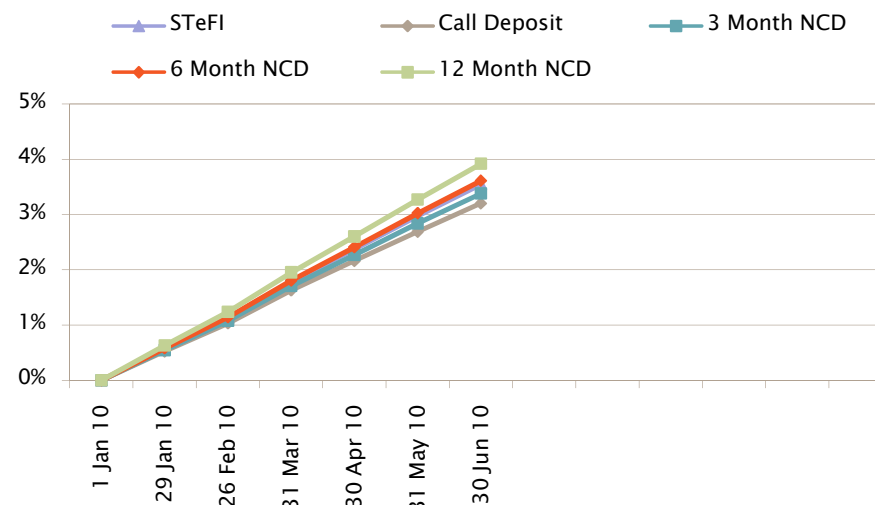


FIXED INTEREST MARKET – HOW THE DIFFERENT SECTORS PERFORMED

CUMULATIVE PERFORMANCE OF CASH INDICES – YTD



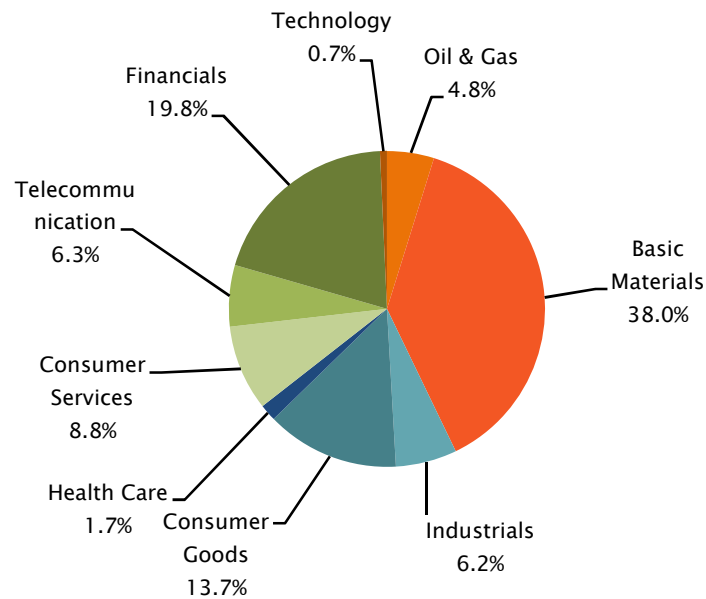

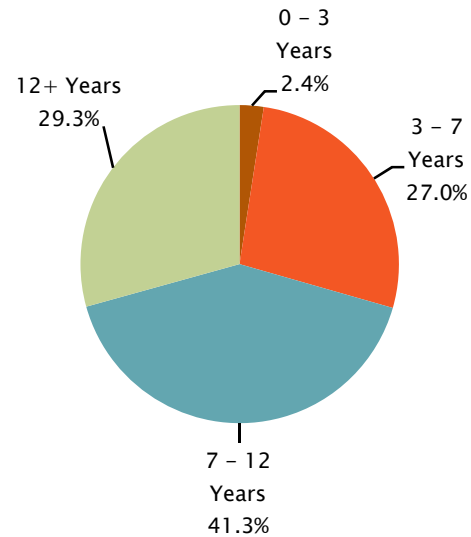

QUARTERLY COMPOSITION OF ALL INDICES

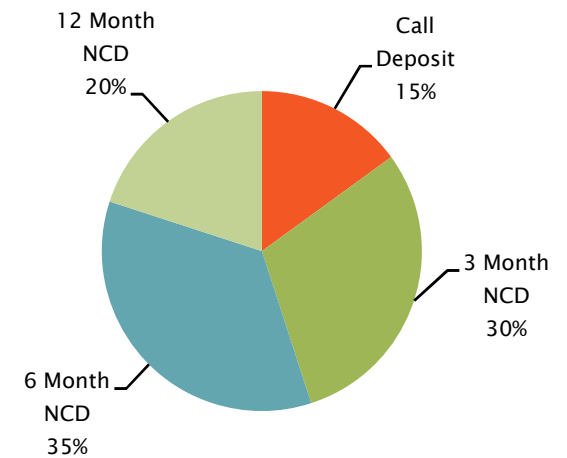
Equity – All Share

Market and economic update

Globally speaking

Background

- Global markets continued the rebound which started in March into the second quarter, with the FTSE World Index returning 11.9% and 9.7% in April and May respectively, before shedding 0.5% in June.
- The strong second quarter performance from global stock markets resulted in the FTSE World Index's strongest calendar quarter return of 22.1%.
- The rebound of global stock markets from their lows of early March reflects the expectation that the worst may be behind us.
- Commodity prices which reached a low in December 2008 have also rallied strongly on the back of the success China has had on sustaining growth through a range of stimulus programmes.
- The Chinese are also taking advantage of lower prices to increase their raw stockpiles.
- The dollar continued its volatility into the second quarter and weakened against most developed and emerging currencies in this period.

Outlook

- Global business conditions are stabilising, and business confidence is recovering.
- As the financial markets return to normality, the focus of investors has shifted more and more to the huge increase in fiscal deficits, especially in the US.
- These fiscal deficits may take time to reverse and could have adverse effects on future government spending and robust global economic recovery.
- The combination of aggressive money creation and rising government spending poses a serious inflationary threat.
- Funding these large deficits is proving increasingly difficult and government bond yields have risen significantly since the panic buying of bonds in December last year.
- Investors around the world continue to see some pockets of green shoots and appear to be fairly optimistic regarding expectations for equity returns.
- However, we continue to believe that the process of de-leveraging may continue for many years and have a direct impact on corporate earnings.
- As a result, we expect global equity markets' volatility to continue and the prospect for real returns in the next 4-5 years not to be as favourable as in the past.

Market and economic update

Locally speaking

Background

- Locally, the FTSE/JSE All Share Index (ALSI) experienced good returns for the quarter, returning 8.6% in rands.
- The ALSI return in this period was mainly driven by Industrials and Financials, with returns of 14.0% and 12.3% respectively, whilst Resources only returned 2.7% for the quarter.
- The rand performed extremely well against both the dollar and the euro over the period, appreciating by 19.4% and 14.3% respectively.
- The rand appreciation against the dollar helped the ALSI return 34.8% for the quarter in US dollars, outperforming the FTSE World Index by 12.7%, in line with most emerging markets.
- Economically, in common with the rest of the world South Africa is also in recession.
- Exports, which were worth \$8.2bn in July 2008 declined to \$4.8bn in April, the adverse effects of which have flowed through into the rest of the economy.
- However, South Africa has displayed greater resilience than other countries.
- This partly because the government was already embarking on a major increase in spending on capital projects and because our banking system has emerged from the banking crisis relatively unscathed.

Outlook

- Inflation has proved remarkably persistent despite the recession. Wage increases are and will continue to surprise on the upside.
- Accordingly, the Reserve Bank has chosen to leave the repo rate unchanged at 7.5% at its latest meeting after cutting by 4.5% from the peak with further cuts improbable. It is difficult to justify further rate cuts as long as inflation remains so high despite having negative economic growth.
- The slow down in exports continues to undermine the recovery of the major sectors of the economy and consequently economic growth.
- Since January 1996, global emerging market fund managers have been underweight South African equities. In April 2009, these managers up weighted South African equities to neutral for the first time and continued to do so for the rest of the quarter.
- As a result, foreigners were net buyers of South African equities in the second quarter. Nevertheless, we believe investors should remain cautious especially considering the high levels of earnings that persist.
- The ALSI is currently trading at a price-to-earnings ratio of 10.7 times its historic earnings. We believe that many South African companies' earnings remain high relative to their history and we would encourage investors to be sceptical of their sustainability going forward.
- Our portfolios continue to consist mainly of companies with high quality and diversified earning streams as well as companies where earnings are currently below what we consider as normal.
- Furthermore, we are underweight cyclical stocks due to the high profit margins seen by many of these companies in an environment where consumers are struggling both globally and locally
- Despite the good investor sentiment towards the stock market and good returns over the quarter, we do not focus our efforts on trying to predict the start of a new bull market, but rather continue to analyse individual companies from a bottom-up perspective, to determine the most attractive opportunities based on a four year investment horizon.
